In the United States, we elect a new president every four years. Nowadays it is a law that no one can be elected for more than two four-year terms. But that wasn't always a law. Before it was a law, it was a tradition. George Washington was elected president without no one running against him 1788 and again in 1792. He probably would have been elected again in 1796, but he decided that two terms was enough. Thomas Jefferson, the third president, agreed that if there was no term limit that anyone elected president could possibly end up in the position for life. Following George Washington's example, all of our presidents left office voluntarily after two terms, up until 1933, when Franklin Delano Roosevelt decided to run for a third term. He won, and was even elected for a fourth term, but died a few months after his inauguration. After that, a law was put into place limiting the number of full terms a president could serve to two.
