

We add the suffix -sion to a word to make it into a noun. Often writers are confused as to when they should add -sion or -tion. We *usually* add -sion to a word when:

- 1) the word ends in the letter *l* (propel propulsion)
- 2) If the suffix will follow an *n* or *r*, especially if the original word ends in -se or *d* (extend extension)
- 3) the word originally ends in -ss or -mit (discuss discussion admit admission)
