(*As You Like It* Act II Scene 7)

- ② Shall I compare thee to a summer's day?
Thou art more lovely and more temperate...
(*Sonnet 18*)

- ③ Beauty too rich for use, for earth too dear!
So shows a snowy dove trooping with crows
As yonder lady o'er her fellows shows.
(*Romeo and Juliet* Act I Scene 5)
