ANSWERS

- A. Does "they" refer to the deer or the hunters? Change one of the pronouns to a noun, or add words that would clarify whether it is the deer or the hunters who are far away from where they live.
- B. Who danced, the flames or the people in the village? Replace the pronoun with a noun, either the flames or the people.
- C. What was beautiful and gentle, the hummingbird or the heart of the mountain? You could reverse the first sentence to say, "From the heart of the mountain sprang the hummingbird, which...."
